COVID-19--restrictions, if any, will apply to all participants (competitors, grooms, volunteers and staff). As this is a bit of a moving target, we will send out final requirements with the manager's letter shortly before the show with any updates from USEF, the facility, or the state.

Entry Procedures: An entry form must be completed for each show and horse/rider combination. Entries will be filled on a first come, first served basis based on RECEIPT. Entries must be Received or completed and paid online by midnight December 15, 2022. Do not send entries requiring a delivery signature or a post entry fee will be charged. Please use the entry form contained in this Prize List or from the CARA website at http://www.caradressage.com. Send the completed entry form, copies of all cards and registrations and all fees to the Show Secretary. Make checks payable to Central Arizona Riding Academy. Vaccination records must be available for examination per USEF GR844. An entry is incomplete without proof of memberships and horse registrations and will be charged internet search fees. Online entries are strongly suggested via EquestrianEntries.com (See below)

By signing the entries, Riders competing on more than 2 horses, agree that they may have less than 50 minutes between rides on different horses. The signature is agreement in writing per USEF DR126.2.b.5.

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org. No refunds will be given if competitor cannot provide proof of completion.

Please attach a copy of your Safe Sport Trained certificate. There are multiple modules. The training can be found at https://www.usef.org/compete/resources-forms/rules-regulations/safe-sport THIS IS NOT OPTIONAL! No refunds will be given if competitor cannot provide proof of completion. USEF website takes up to 3 days to reflect completion so please bring printed certificate.

Entering Champagne I only: nothing special is required; just pick which stabling option you want—Haul in or Thursday night only.

Entering both Champagne I and II: fill out both entries (Champagne I and II) and select either Haul in or Thursday-Sunday stabling.

Entering ONLY Champagne II: Because the Champagne I show is all day Friday, competitors **arriving before 4 pm Friday** must enter Champagne I as a non-competing horse (office fee and schooling fee will apply but not drug fee). Put your stabling on Champagne I and select Thursday-Sunday, Friday-Sunday or Haul in. If you wish **to arrive after 4 pm**, select either haul in or Friday-Sunday stabling and fill out only Champagne II.

On-Line Entries: Visit EquestrianEntries.com on opening day of competition. The signature page and other documents may be uploaded in Equestrian Entries and submitted with show entry or e-mailed separately to Show Secretary. You can also use this system to fill out show entries and mail a check to Show Secretary at no cost.

Office Fee: Required for each show. Non-refundable.

Refunds: No refunds (including stabling) for any reason after the closing date, including cancellation of a class or classes, or all or part of the competition due to severe weather, accident or any other emergency. Before closing, all fees except office fee are refunded. USEF fee and Qualifying fees (if horse is not on show grounds) will be refunded.

STABLING

Stabling will be in several barns. Stabling in the Premium barn is limited and will be awarded on a <u>first come</u>, <u>first served</u> basis. (See sponsorship page on website <u>www.caradressage.com</u> for exceptions to the first come, first served rule). Entry is complete and logged when entry and payment are RECEIVED. Stabling for Day stall, Thursday night only or Champagne II only will be in Annex stabling. Horses entered in BOTH Champagne I (competing or schooling) and Champagne II are eligible for Premium barn stabling.

Stable Groups: If you want to be stabled with a group, please provide the Show Secretary with only ONE name (either individual or Trainer barn) for entire group. Inform the show secretary of stabling requirements when submitting entries (i.e., stallions). Barns wishing to stable together must submit entries early or together. If the Premium barn fills, additional horses, regardless of their stabling preference, will be in the Annex barns. Entries received after the Premium barn is full may not be stabled with their group. Covid-19 restrictions may require stabling to be spread.

- Late Entries with stabling location requests will be honored, if possible. However, late entries may not be stabled with their requested group after barn charts have been finalized and submitted to the venue.
- Smoking is prohibited in stall areas. Use sharps containers provided in barns. Competition management may fine any
 individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other
 sharp disposable instruments. Bio-hazard medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All competitors
 and their agents are responsible for proper disposal of this waste.

Prices apply to Horse or Tack Stall. All horses on site overnight must be stabled. Stalls will not be reserved until payment is received by the Show Secretary. The barn manager will not be onsite until Thursday AM. No one will be available to assist Wednesday arrivals and arenas may not be available for riding.

Stabling: Stabling in the premium barn is limited and will be assigned by entry payment receipt priority as described above. You may request annex stabling on entry if you wish. If stalls are filled, later entries will be placed in annex stabling. Stall groups will be split if premium stalls are filled.

Bedding: Shavings may be ordered at \$13 per bag and will be delivered to your assigned stall. Indicate the number of bags on entry form. Bedding will be available for purchase during the show beginning on Thursday am. No outside bedding permitted. 2 bags of bedding will be included with stabling including tack stall; 1 bag for day stall or Thursday night only

Class List: Use the Class List below.

Test of Choice classes: If competitor wishes to ride the same test twice in the same day, they may enter the regular class, for example Training 2 and Test of Choice --Training, test 2. Management reserves the right to move people in or out of these classes. Test of Choice will be pinned by division, not test. Freestyle will be pinned by test not division.

Age restricted classes: Amateur competitors age 50 and over may enter classes specified as AA/Vintage classes. These classes are eligible as GAIG/USDF Regional qualifiers.

One Rider Rule: At no time during the competition may a horse entered in a USEF qualifying class be ridden by anyone other than the athlete entered in that class under penalty of disqualification from the class. The competition is considered to begin when the horse arrives on the show grounds and ends when the dressage competition concludes. (Exception: Grooms riding on a loose rein)

Opportunity Classes: Will be offered at Training Level tests 1 and 2. Opportunity classes are intended to introduce competitors to showing at USEF/USDF licensed shows without incurring additional membership fees. They are for entry level riders. Competitors showing only in opportunity classes are exempt from USDF and USEF membership, horse and drug fees. Classes are pinned Junior and All Other. These classes do not count toward high point, year-end, USEF or USDF awards. All active senior USEF members must complete SafeSport training even if showing only in Opportunity classes. See GR821 for more information on Opportunity.

Dress: USEF DR120. If you have any questions about dress, please ask the technical delegate.

Tests: https://www.usdf.org/competitions/competitors/tests.asp Effective 12/1/2022. We will use current FEI tests. Tests are available on the FEI website, fei.org. The Prix St James Test is attached.

Freestyle music and eligibility: Please provide 2 CDs of your music AND electronic copy --email file to announcer, stephenapmadoc@yahoo.com. If you do email your music, please do it several days before the show starts. Please include a cell number where he could reach you with your name in case there is any problem with your music. If you don't email your music, you may bring a thumb drive or a CD but please take it to the show office ASAP when you arrive. That will give him plenty of time to check it out and download your music before we do a sound check. He does recommend you bring a backup (CD, USB flash drive, thumb drive). Sound check times will be Thursday and Friday afternoon and posted in the show office. Please check USEF rules for any Freestyle eligibility changes. Please refer to DR 129.9.

Scratches: Scratches before the closing date may be made for any reason and all fees will be refunded except the Office Fee. Competitors have the responsibility to inform the **show office** of their intention to scratch. Anyone who does not appear for their scheduled dressage test without informing the **show office** prior to the scratch will be considered a "no-show" and subsequent rides may be scratched and filled from the wait list.

Late/Post Entries: Accepted as space allows. Add \$35 per entry. See **Stabling** section for late entry stabling information. After the competition is filled, a wait list will be established.

Changes in horse or rider: see entry fees above

Pony Measurements: All ponies must have a USEF pony measurement card. If needed, pony measurements will be conducted on Thursday afternoon by appointment. The competitor is responsible for the veterinarian fees. Schedule is dependent on veterinarian availability. Contact secretary to schedule. See DR135.5. If you plan to have your pony measured, you MUST notify the show secretary in writing by no later than 12 noon on Monday before the show. Both shows are National Dressage Pony Cup Partner shows.

Not Competing (Schooling) Horses: Must pay a \$30 schooling fee, office fee and fill out entry. If the horse is entered in Leadline only there is no schooling fee but need completed entry and class fee.

RV or LQ Trailer Hookups: Please contact facility at 480-356-3798 to reserve a space. If arriving before Thursday MUST be approved through show. Additional fees may apply.

Parking: Trailers must be parked in designated areas.

Ride Times: Preliminary ride times and a show schedule will be available on the Fox Village Ride Times and Results website https://www.foxvillage.com/Results and CARA website, http://www.caradressage.com. Final ride times will be posted at the show by noon Thursday for Champagne I and Friday for Champagne II. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to verify final ride times at the show. Please notify the show secretary of any scheduling conflicts. Ride times will not be mailed.

RESULTS: We are implementing paperless scoring at both shows. Scoresheets will be emailed to the rider using the email provided on the entry. MAKE SURE THIS EMAIL ADDRESS IS CORRECT or you will not receive scoresheets in a timely manner.

Arenas: Both uncovered or covered competition and warm-up arenas (sand mix). All tests are ridden in 20 x 60m arenas. Arenas will be open for schooling on Thursday. During the shows, competition arenas will be open for hand walking only outside the dressage court up to one half hour prior to the start of the first class, and mounted schooling after close of competition until show office closes. Arenas will be watered and worked throughout the show. Para Equestrian tests may be in either 20x40m or 20x60m depending on test level and number of entries.

Pets: All pets must be on a leash per USEF GR1301.6 or subject to fine. No pets inside arena fencing at any time. Loose dogs will be captured, and owner must pay \$50 which will be donated to the Arizona Humane Society.

Concessions: Available on the grounds.

Numbers: Two numbers will be provided for each horse. All horses on the show grounds must have a number on when out of their stalls.

Awards: First place Prize and ribbon for Open, AA and Jr/YR divisions. Ribbons awarded through 6th place. Test of Choice class placing will be determined by division, by percentage ranking, regardless of which test is ridden within each class. Freestyle classes are pinned Open by level. Ties broken per USEF DR 123.3 and 123.9.

High Point Awards (Champagne II Only): Scores from Freestyle, Para Equestrian, Intro, Opportunity, Rider, Equitation, Prix St. James, Exhibition or pony classes do not count for High Point level awards. The Prix St James Challenge -- Winner take all \$500 prize money

Riders must ride either 4-3 (class 143) or PSG (class 151) on Saturday and PSJ (Prix St James-class 651) on Sunday on the same horse. 4-3 or PSG class may be ridden in either a snaffle or double bridle and the PSJ class must be ridden in a snaffle bridle (DR121.2). The two scores will be combined. The prize money is \$500 awarded to the winner with the highest percentage total. If score is tied, money will be split. Winner will receive a check within 30 days.

Golf Cart Rental: Thursday through Sunday Rental. 2 Passenger \$225. You may reserve a golf cart by including payment with show entries and informing the Show Secretary. Refer to USEF GR1301.7 published in full below. After the close date, contact Show Manager by one week prior to the show to ensure availability. Cancellation of golf cart reservations not accepted after we finalize the number of carts to be delivered to the show.

Operation of Motorized Vehicles: USEF GR1301.7 applies. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Other: Show management reserves the right to make changes including, but not limited to, cancel, split or combine classes, limit class size, change arenas, limit the number of rides and number of horses per rider and cancel, add or change judges. The show committee reserves the right to refuse any entry for cause. Show management reserves the right to deny entry to any competitor if the competitor or owner has outstanding debt to CARA. EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF OR FEI RULES AND WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN **ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.** It is the responsibility of the competitor to be familiar with these rules. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final. Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation. In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform. It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT: Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

Disease Outbreak Rule: In the face of a disease outbreak, the show committee reserves the right to follow the AVMA (American Veterinary Medicine Association) and/or the AAEP (American Association of Equine Practitioners) recommendations as to what testing would be necessary to consider a horse free from the disease in question. They also reserve the right to require written proof that said testing has been performed within the recommended period of time. If the competitor does not adhere to the requirements, the show committee can refuse entrance to the show.

Some diseases are "Reportable Diseases", meaning they must be reported to the State of Arizona Department of Agriculture. These diseases are subject to quarantine rules of the state. An example of one such disease is

Vesicular Stomatitis. In the case of reportable diseases, a health certificate is required from an accredited veterinarian with proper statement regarding said disease to accompany the horse.

Since this rule could apply to any number of diseases, and it would be impossible to list them all here, the show committee will post the testing/health certificate requirements on the sponsor web page if there is a current disease outbreak in the area.

Headgear Rule: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Please refer to DR120 for dress code provisions while in the competition ring. Consult the Technical Delegate if you have questions or concerns.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with the following association numbers before the day(s) of the competition.

- * United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) for horse, owner, rider, trainer and/or coach.
- * United States Dressage Federation (USDF) for horse, owner and rider. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:

Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. **Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

2023 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2023 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
 A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF.
 For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division.

The Arizona State Championships will be held at the Tucson Dressage Club Fall Festival I & II Dressage Shows, November 18-19, 2023 at the Pima County Fairgrounds, Tucson, AZ.

For scores to count toward qualification for the State Championships, a \$25 nomination fee must be paid for each horse. This fee must be paid before any rides will count toward qualifying.

Since only one horse/rider combination can compete at State Championships, the fee goes toward the horse. Multiple riders may qualify on the same horse if the nomination fee has been paid for that horse. If multiple riders qualify on the same horse, **one rider only** may compete in the State Championship classes and the concurrent Fall Festival show. **See State Championship Rule 5.**

There are two ways to file your Nomination Form:

- 1. Send the nomination with a \$25 check, payable to Tucson Dressage Club to the address listed below.
- 2. Include the nomination and check, payable to TDC, with your show entry to any Recognized show in Arizona-ADA, Tucson Dressage Club (TDC), CARA or Road Runner.

PURPOSE: The higher level horse should be able to perform basic movements at any time. The rider should return to lower-level movements as soon as he feels any tension or irregularity beginning. In all movements regularity of gait, suppleness of back, acceptance of the bit and lateral flexibility are of first priority. Once these basic elements are re-established in calmness and harmony, the rider again might ask the horse for higher-level movements.

Conditions: standard arena, average time 7 minutes. A plain snaffle bridle with noseband. Short coat should be worn. All trot work is sitting, unless specified otherwise.

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
